Chipboard (Cereal Boxes)	Aluminum Cans
White Paper (Printer, Fax, Copier)	Steel and Tin Cans (Vegetable, Juice)
Colored Paper	Pie Tins
Notebook & Yellow Pad Paper	Aluminum Foil
Envelopes (Regular & Window)	Glass Bottles & Jars (All Colors)
File Folders	Plastic Bottles (Soda, Milk, Juice, Food, Detergent, etc.)
Junk Mail	
Newspapers	Plastic Food Containers (Yogurt, Margarine, etc.)
Magazines	

All paper containers must be plastic bagged.

All glass, plastic, tin, bi-metal cans, and aluminum must be empty and contain less than 5% food debris.
